


Our expertise is in providing reliable and accessible air quality data, which you can then leverage for your own community action and impact.



Two of Our Previous Community Projects

Our Collaboration with UNICEF

Together with UNICEF and the Lao government, we deployed AirGradient monitors across 150 schools, expanding coverage from one monitor to 160 in two months. The country's first air quality monitoring network provides real-time air quality data to protect children, enable school closures during hazardous conditions, and support policy decisions.



Our Collaboration with Pacha Ayllu

Pacha Ayllu is a group of concerned parents who didn't know whether the air quality their children were breathing in Quito, Guayaquil, and Cuenca was healthy. As a result, they started the Family-led Clean Air Observatory, focusing on schools and areas where children were most exposed to pollution. With 15 donated monitors, they were able to provide real-time data for educators to take precautionary measures, and advocated for policy changes in their communities.

The OpenAir Foundation is a culmination of AirGradient's years of work and experience with communities across the globe. Now, as the Open Air Foundation, we look forward to continue growing a diverse group of partners.

Our vision does not just address the air quality gap, but also the inequality in accessing data. We want to focus our efforts on communities that are most affected and have the least access.
